Area of Focus	Impact
To provide high quality tuition to engage and inspire children in a range of sporting activities	High quality PE is delivered by an external coach to all children at Raglan. The external PE coach delivered high quality PE to children on site. In addition KS2 had hockey coaching and Year 1 and Year 2 had tennis coaching and Year 1 have had cricket coaching. Years 2 and 3 had cricket coaching.
To provide Year 4 pupils with high quality swimming lessons	No swimming has taken place this year due to continued COVID restrictions. We continue to explore the possibility of providing swimming for children currently in Year 4 next year in addition to children who will be in Year 4 to ensure that all children are able to swim confidently. It will not be possible to give children in current Year 5 this opportunity.
To improve expertise of staff in delivering movement and dance lessons	It has not been possible to deliver dance and movement training for staff as it was due to take place when bubbles not able to mix. This will remain a focus on next year's SIP.
To deliver INSET based on the PE audit findings	Area highlighted in audit as above. Plan to deliver this training next year.
Links with other subjects that contribute to pupils overall achievement and their greater spiritual, moral, social and cultural skills	Active Maths has continued and there has been a positive impact on confidence of all children attending sessions.

	<p>Focus of PE lessons has been on team building and working together, as well as improving skills. Behaviour of children has been excellent.</p> <p>Year 4 attended an Outdoor Activity Day at Kingswood Activity Centre (in lieu of PGL)</p>
Extra-Curricular	<p>Sports coach has continued to deliver training to Midday Meal Supervisors in how to support children to be actively engaged at lunch times. New equipment has been prioritised for KS1 and KS2 playing. Daily children actively engaged in a range of sports activities and games at playtime. Year 5 children have continued to be trained as play leaders and were able to support children across the school. Children who took part in training have grown in confidence and have supported younger children at playtime and lunch with arranging activities, games and ensuring all children enjoy the lunchtime experience.</p>
Participation and success in competitive school sports	<p>We continue to provide opportunities for children to take part in competitive sport. Staff members, our PE coach and external coaches run afterschool clubs in cross country, tennis, hockey, football and multi-skills, gymnastics and Karate. PE lead and PE coach identified competitions and sporting opportunities across the borough.</p> <p>Palace for Life – Play on the Pitch Festival at Selhurst Park for year5/6 girls</p> <p>Bromley Borough QuadKids athletics competition at Norman Park, run by School Games Organisers for years 3/4/5/6</p> <p>Sports Day gave all children the opportunity to take part in competitive sport. This event took place in year group bubbles on the school playground due to Covid restrictions.</p>
