Area of Focus	Impact
To provide high quality tuition to engage and inspire children in a range of sporting activities	High quality PE is delivered by an external coach to all children at Raglan. The external PE coach delivered high quality PE to children on site. In addition KS2 had hockey coaching and cricket engagement days. First full year of embedding new PE scheme from PE hub.
To provide Year 4, 5 and Year 6 pupils with high quality swimming lessons	Swimming was able to restart this year for Year 4. Make-up sessions were also offered to the current Year 5 children. 90% of children were able to swim 25 meters. In Year 6, 85% of all children could swim 25m.
To improve expertise of staff in delivering movement and dance lessons	Covid restrictions still in place at start of the academic year so this did not happen – focus was on embedding new scheme
To deliver INSET based on the PE audit findings	Area highlighted in audit as above. Plan to deliver this training next year. See above
Links with other subjects that contribute to pupils overall achievement and their greater spiritual, moral, social and cultural skills	Active Maths has continued and there has been a positive impact on confidence of all children attending sessions. Focus of PE lessons has been on team building and working together, as well as improving skills. Behaviour of children has been excellent.

Extra-Curricular	Sports coach has continued to deliver training to Midday Meal Supervisors in how to support children to be actively engaged at lunch times. New equipment has been prioritised for KS1 and KS2 playing. Daily children actively engaged in a range of sports activities and games at playtime. Year 5 children have continued to been trained as play leaders and were able to support children across the school. Children who took part in training have grown in confidence and have supported younger children at playtime and lunch with arranging activities, games and ensuring all children enjoy the lunchtime experience.
Participation and success in competitive school sports	We continue to provide opportunities for children to take part in competitive sport. Staff members, our PE coach and external coaches run afterschool clubs in cross country, tennis, hockey, football and multiskills, gymnastics and Karate. PE lead and PE coach identified competitions and sporting opportunities across the borough. Year 5 and Year 6 Hockey competition at Langley Park School. KS1 Easter Bunny Run at St Peter & St Pauls Catholic Primary School. Year 2 Scootsure Scooter training Crystal Palace Cross Country runs KS2 Bromley Borough football competitions Year 5/6 boys and Language Provision Crystal Palace - Play on the Pitch Year 4 girls Sports Day gave all children the opportunity to take part in competitive sport.
