Home Learning

Home learning will continue to be set via Seesaw and will be assigned on Fridays. Seesaw learning will include a spelling activity and an activity related to another area of the curriculum. The children may also be assigned an activity on Mathletics. Please can all activities be completed by the following Thursday. Children are also expected to read aloud to someone at home and their reading record completed at least **three** times a week. Support for reading is invaluable in terms of the children's progress in their writing across all subjects.

How can you help at home?

English – Please can you encourage your child to read to an adult at least **three** times a week. We would appreciate it if you could ask them questions about what they are reading e.g. What is this paragraph about? What do you think will happen next? How has the author described one of the characters? Please sign the record book each time. Please could you also encourage your child to complete the weekly spelling activities.

Maths – Please support your child in learning their times tables and identifying their division facts. Many children need further support to tell the time using analogue time, including using the 24 hour clock. Maths concepts can be consolidated by encouraging children to regularly go on Mathletics.

Year 4 Wider Curriculum

As Historians, we will be:

- Looking at the importance of 1833 and the abolition of slavery
- Describing the Atlantic slave trade
- Understanding the life of slave during these years
- Learning about Harriet Tubman and the Underground Railroad
- Understanding what slavery looks like today

In Computing...

We will be looking at using the iPads for animation

As Musicians we ... are working with BYMT to provide children with some outstanding music teaching. The children will take part in a rolling programme consisting of singing lessons, music technology and instrumental lessons. The objective is to provide a continuum of study, giving students the opportunity to further develop their musical skills.

In RE... we return to our study of Judaism, exploring the different ways in which young Jews reach important 'milestones' in their lives, such as the Bar Mitzvah, and how they show their commitment to God. The children will compare these practices with their own lives and consider the important 'rites of passage' they may go through – either now or in the future.

In PE we... will be continuing to develop key skills with Coach on a **Tuesday**.

In Wolves teacher led PE lesson, on **Wednesdays**, the children will be developing their dance routines and movement around animals

In Dolphins, on **Thursday**, the children have their swimming sessions in the afternoon with the swimming coaches at the Bromley Pavilion.

As Scientists... we will be taking our learning into the outdoors as we look at living things and their habitats. To begin with, the children will learn how to summarise the characteristics of a 'living thing' before observing them in different settings and learning how to categorise organisms by their shared characteristics. Weather permitting, we will carry out some outdoor investigations, too, and consider how environments are impacted and changed by human activities – and how this may directly affect living things and their homes.

In French... we are revising our vocabulary and phrase knowledge of the human body in order to explore what can go wrong with it! Using their developing speaking and writing skills, the children will describe various ailments and learn how to explain that they are ill as part of a conversation.

As artsits we ... will be diving into South American and rainforest art by looking at a number of prominent artists including Rousseau, then recreating and designing their own pieces with printing and painting.
