Phonics...

How can you help at home?

Some of the children have been learning to form the letters of their name in fun and exciting ways.

This involves holding their pencils in the correct grip.

Please promote and support this at home by encouraging them to write in different medias.

At home you could help them to write with sticks in mud, water and brushes on walls bubbles in the bath, Flour and lap trays in the kitchen. As well as pencils on scrap paper and envelopes.

The children have been finding shapes in the environment, cubes, cylinders and pyramids, maybe they can spot these at home too.



As mathematicians we will

Continuing to count and relate numbers up to 5. Identifying the symbols and counting objects in play. The children will learn to experiment with their own symbols to represent numbers.

We have a fish and chip shop in our role play area and are able to use maths and counting to count the items on the plates and in the frying pans

We have been shape hunting and the children will be familiar with the 3D shapes, cylinder and pyramids.
