### Our Topic this term ....

This term we will be learning all about superheroes! The children will be reading lots of superhero stories and will even be the author of their very own superhero book! They will use their imagination to transform into superheroes in our role play areas. We will be putting our designing hats on and use different materials to make a superhero cape. We will also learn about real heroes in our community, such as police officers, firefighters, dentist, doctors, etc. If any parents are interested in speaking to the children about their 'superhero role' then please let us know! f you have anything at home that links to our superhero topic such as superhero costumes, stories or action figures, please speak to

As mathematicians we will... Practise doubling numbers up to 20, sharing amounts between different groups, beginning to identify odd and even numbers and explore patterns and spatial reasoning further.

**Phonics...** During our phonics sessions the children will continue to use their phase 3 sounds and move into learning Phase 4 sounds.

Please continue practising reading and writing digraphs at home with your children as they still get a little muddled when reading and when applying it to their writing. Encourage them to write sentences using words with these digraphs and reading it back to you. We are practicing writing using a capital letter at the beginning of the sentence, finger spaces, and a punctuation at the end.
