We are exploring...

'The Lonely Beast' by Chris Judge. We will learn to write descriptive noun phrases and include them in our writing about what the Beast packs for his journey. We will write diary entries as the Beast describing his long journey. Then we will become journalists and write newspaper reports about the Beast's arrival in the city. We will continue to use adverbs of time (first, then, next, after that) and conjunctions (and, but, because, so). We will continue working on using capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks and question marks. We will be trying to include interesting adjectives in our writing to add description. We will continue to practise our letter formation and begin to learn the different joins to join-up our handwriting. In Phonics, we will be revising Phase 5 and learning about the suffixes -ed, -est, -er, -s and -es. We will continue to practise sounding out and blending real and alien words and spelling words by sounding them out.

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Year 1 Newsletter Summer Term 2 2023

Welcome back to the last half term of Year 1! The year has whizzed by and we are beginning to think about the move up to Year 2. We have lots of exciting learning planned for this half term; we can't wait to get started!

As Mathematicians we will...

We will explore numbers to 100. We will represent numbers to 100 using concrete objects and drawings, identifying the tens and ones. We will show our understanding of place value by ordering and comparing numbers to 100 and saying one more and one less than a number. Then, throughout the half term we will be applying our knowledge to different problems. We will also, learn to read the time to the hour and half past. We will then be learning to identify coins and find the total value of a group of coins. We will apply our knowledge of counting in groups of 2, 5 and 10 to count coins and find different combinations of coins that total the same amount.

How can you help at home?

- Complete the spelling home learning activities each week on Seesaw.
- Try to read at home for 5-10 minutes everyday. Remember to record this in your reading record.
- When reading at home, remind children to sound out and blend unfamiliar words. Also, ask them questions for example, what do you think the book is about? What will happen next? How do you think ... is feeling? How else could the story end?
- Practise recognising numbers to 100, counting to and back from 100 and reading and writing numbers to 100 correctly. Practise saying one more and one less than a number.
- Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s using money i.e. 2ps, 5ps, 10ps.
- The children will be learning to read the time to the hour and half past on an analogue so encourage them to read the time each day!
