Character Virtue of the week



Dear Parents and Carers,

Your children have continued to make the best of starts to this academic year. The children in Nursery and Reception have settled in well learning new routines and enjoying learning through play. It is staggering how quickly the Nursery and Reception children learn their new daily routines. All credit to them, and to you as parents, for the way they have all come in full of enthusiasm. Our new Year 1 children have begun their outdoor learning lessons this week which is always a terrific way to start off the year - searching for mini-beasts. Year 2 have gotten really stuck into their maths learning which fills me with joy! I do hope that the children will challenge themselves to learn not only their 2s, 5s and 10s, this year but also master their 3s, 4s, and 11s as well.

Sharks and Frogs have quickly settled into their learning routines and I have enjoyed seeing the children getting fully immersed with their individual, small group and whole class learning activities. I have been particularly impressed with the excellent role-modelling from the older children in Frogs – the new Year 6 children in Frogs have begun the year wonderfully.

It has been brilliant to see Year 3 already producing some incredible art work so early on. The children in our school love art and Year 3 have certainly shown some excellent early talent for this. I also know that Year 3 have got stuck straight into learning their times tables so please follow this up at home. We really need all of Year 3 to have mastered as many of their times tables as possible by the end of this year. It is possible for Year 3 to learn them all by Christmas (as so many of last years' Year 3 did!) What a joy it has been to read the question responses that Year 4 have completed for their Whole Class reading. The Percy Jackson books are a terrific inspiration for the children. I also know that Year 4 have also made a tremendous start with their maths learning as well. The children have been consolidating learning in maths, but also taking on additional challenges — and some that would test Year 6 children!

I have to give year 5 and 6 every credit for the way they have both started the year in terms of their enthusiasm for school, and their role-modelling. They each as individuals, and as a collective group, have such an important role to play in sustaining and further improving the culture of our school – promoting our Raglan Character Virtues. In terms of their learning, it has been terrific to see some very polished writing narratives in both year groups. Year 5 have been writing diary entries which have been imaginative and really personable – as a diary should be. Year 6 have been writing from one of the character's points of view in the book they are currently studying – not an easy task! What has been equally impressive for both year groups has been the quality of the composition of writing. The challenge now is to ensure that they are rigorously using punctuation, spelling and grammatical constructs accurately, so that the incredible compositional elements are enjoyed fully by the reader. One of the best experiences I have weekly is reading the writing narrative over the shoulders of the children when I am walking around as they are creating it. Brilliant! Inspired!

Friends of Whitehall Rec Protect our Wildlife Area

Our community is blessed to have Whitehall Rec on our doorstep. As you know, it is an incredibly valuable resource for our school. It is extremely important that we continue to work in partnership with Friends of Whitehall Rec and be at the forefront of the community to protect and maintain it — especially its wildlife area. Unfortunately, there are times when members of the public (younger and older) misuse or mistreat this wonderful community area. We have little control over members of the public that may do this, but my hope is that all of our children role-model the respectful behaviour when accessing the park that will ensure that all that it has to offer, including its wildlife is enjoyed by everyone who visits.

This morning our Year 4 children were invited to Whitehall Rec by Ideverde and Friends of Whitehall for a meadow safari session. This enabled the children to gain further understanding of how precious the green space we have is, and why we need to respect and protect it – and the wildlife that it hosts.

Thank you to the existing parents and carers for engaging with new parents and helping them to learn more about our school. This Coffee morning was an excellent idea which I take no credit for. This was a suggestion that came from last autumn's Parents' and Carers' Forum. For me this shows the way we work in partnership as a community. You all have great ideas which the school can utilise. This is just one of those brilliant ideas that has already had a positive impact on our new parents. Thank you again for all attending.

And Finally...

If you have not already established a routine for home learning then please do so. Teachers should be providing home learning imminently, if not already. I know my maths group have already received their home learning from me (due next Tuesday remember math's legends!)

In addition to the home learning that comes home from us, I always recommend to READ, READ and READ with your children every chance you get. For those children that are proficient readers, have discussions with them about the books they are reading. Ask them what is happening in the story, why things are happening in the story, how the story might unfold or end — and why they think this.... Conversations about books structured around these questions help to develop not just a love of reading but vital inference and deduction reading skills. These particular skills transfer into mathematics and help children breakdown worded problems. I know I say this often — reading provides access to the whole curriculum, so please do as much of it as you can at home.

It would be remiss of me to also not champion times tables. Please also use any and every opportunity to have your children learn, master and rapidly recall their times tables. The younger they learn, master and can rapidly recall these the better!

As you know I failed in my mission to learn every single child's name in the school. I am still determined to complete this, and with the 60 new reception children also. Please do help me, and test my knowledge when you see me outside on the gate. It is hugely important for me to know your children so that I can do all I can to ensure your children feel a real sense of belonging here, that I keep them safe and to facilitate and maximise their experience in our school!
