

Our Topic this Term

We are so excited to dive into our first topic...

'All About Me'



Through our topic we cover the key areas of learning in the Foundation Stage, these are... $\,$

Physical Development in Reception ...

Both Reception classes will have a PE session twice a week. These sessions will take place on a **Monday** with the class teacher and on a **Wednesday** with Coach Alhaji. Children will need to come in to school wearing weather appropriate PE kit. The PE kit consists of a navy blue t-shirt, navy shorts or jogging bottoms and plimsolls or Velcro black trainers. Please ensure that all of the PE kit is labelled, including the plimsolls and trainers.

PE sessions will begin on **Monday 18th September.**

Foundation Stage Reminders...

- Please could your child bring in a coat to school as they will be going outside every day. Practising how to do it up and take it off at home would be very much appreciated.
- Please send a labelled water bottle and your child's book bag in to school every day – thank you.
 Encourage your child to hold their water bottle and not to put it inside their book bag to prevent any leaks.
 Please label all uniform so we can return it to the rightful owner!
- Please check your child's book bag regularly for important letters and information.
- Please could you send in a family photo that we can display in the classroom (we will photocopy and send home the original).

This Term in Phonics...

Phonics is taught on a daily basis. The children will be revisiting phase 1 sounds and then gradually introduced to phase 2 sounds s,a,t,p,i,n. We will be using flash cards, actions and interactive games to engage the children. Phonics lessons provide the initial building blocks to help your child to begin to read and write.

We will be holding a Reception Phonics and Early Reading Workshop. During this meeting, we will share with you some strategies we use to teach Phonics and early reading skills at Raglan.

This term in Maths...

We will be counting forwards and backwards using number lines and visuals to help us. The children will be matching, sorting and comparing objects and numbers.

How can you help at home?

- Encourage your child to count forwards and backwards up to 10 and beyond. This can be done in many fun and exciting ways. E.g. counting fruit in the supermarket or how many cars or buses they see as they walk to school!
- Share a variety of books at home with your child to promote a love of reading and build on comprehension skills such as retelling the story and answering simple questions about the events, characters and settings.

Concept Cat

This year, to support the children's understanding of language and oracy skills, we will be introducing some new vocabulary to the children each week. We will be implementing this through the use of 'Concept Cat', to help make learning new vocabulary engaging and memorable for the children. Maybe you could ask your child which new vocabulary they have learnt each week to reinforce the learning!

Curiosity Cube

We also have a curiosity cube in our classroom! The purpose of a curiosity cube is to excite the children and encourage them to look at things in a different way and discuss what they see, as well as develop their ability to ask questions. They can use a curiosity cube as part of a topic they're learning at school or at home.
