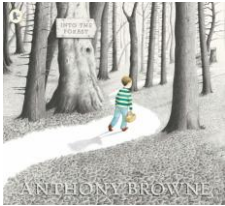


We are venturing into the books...

As Mathematicians we will be...

- Identifying, representing and estimating numbers using different visual representations.
- Finding 10 or 100 more and less than a given number.
- Recognising the place value of each digit in a three-digit number (hundreds, tens, ones) while comparing and ordering numbers up to 1000.
- Reading and writing numbers up to 1000 in numerals and in words.
- Solving number problems and practical problems involving these ideas.
- This will lead on to exploring addition and subtraction.

Year 3 Key Information

- **Home Learning** - Home learning will continue to be set via Seesaw and will be assigned on Fridays. Seesaw learning will include a spelling activity and the children can choose an activity from the Home Learning jigsaw puzzle. They will also be assigned an activity on Mathletics. Please can all activities be completed by the following Thursday.
- **Reading** - Children are also expected to read aloud to someone at home at least 3 times a week. Please record this in your child's Home Reading Journal. They can choose a banded book from the class library.
- Pencil cases are not needed in Year 3.
- Please remember your water bottles.
- A small rucksack can be used for belongings.
- Please also check the labels on your children's clothing and label anything that has no name in.



How can you help at home?

- Continue to encourage your child to read at home every day where possible.
- In addition, please continue to practise reading and spelling common exception words from both Year 1 and 2.
- Please help your child to quickly recall the 3, 4 and 8 times table and related division facts. Please remember to revisit the 2, 5 and 10s times tables and continue to play number bond games to 10 and 20 as well as practicing counting forwards and backwards in 50s.

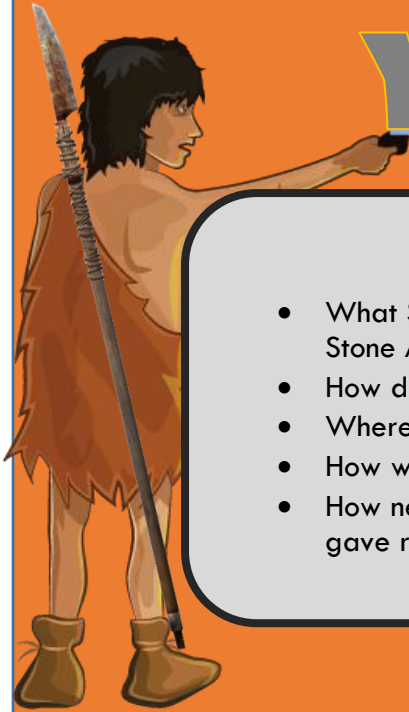

YEAR 3 WIDER CURRICULUM



As Historians we will be asking...

- What Stone Age means and learning about the different periods within the Stone Age.
- How difficult it was for early humans to survive and the tools that they used.
- Where the Stone Age is on a timeline.
- How we can learn about the past from different sources such as Cave Art.
- How new ideas such as farming changed the way that people lived and gave rise to a new historical era.

As Artists we will be...

- Looking at cave art.
- Exploring the properties of charcoal.
- Mixing pigments using natural materials.
- Creating paintings inspired by cave art.

In RE...

We are exploring Sikhism. We will be learning about the Amrit Ceremony and the reasons why a Sikh may choose to join the Khalsa.

In PE we will be...

Continuing to develop key games skills with Coach Alhaji on a Tuesday. In our other PE lesson the children will be developing their awareness of dance choreography.

REMINDER:

Our PE days are **Tuesday** and **Wednesday**. Please ensure the children come in dressed ready for PE as they will be unable to get changed at school.

They should wear appropriate PE kit as per the school guidelines. Earrings should be removed or covered with microporous tape before school. Longer hair should be tied back.

As Scientists we will be ...

- Investigating light and dark.
- Identifying different sources of light.
- Finding out what shadows are and how they are formed.

In Music...

Children will work with Mrs Osborne, a music specialist from BYMT. They will be singing, composing, performing and evaluating their performances.

In Computing ...

We will be using Purple Mash to explore simple programming tools.

In French ...

We will be learning French greetings, numbers and colours in French.
