## **Character Virtue of the Week**



## Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been another busy week at Raglan with the hubbub of learning noise reverberating around the school. It has been a terrific experience to see children grappling with learning whether that be in nursery, EYFS, Sharks and Year 1 where I have seen children continuing to learn their phonics, and in some cases in EYFS already writing a full sentence! I have also seen children in Year 1 forming ever more complex sentences! It has been terrific to see Year 2 approaching their maths with real energy and without fear. Parents, please do set yourselves the goal of having your Year 2 children learn their 3, and 4 times tables by the end of the Christmas holidays. This will be so important as they move thorough the rest of Year 2.

In Frogs, across Year 3 and Year 4 I have seen have seen children working through more complex number work and also fractions. I have enjoyed setting several Year 4 children more challenging arithmetic questions when they ask me to challenge them. I have challenged these children with finding squares and square roots, as well as cubes and cubed roots. I was also filled with joy walking through Year 5 and Year 6 earlier this week and seeing so many children applying their times tables knowledge to: simplify fractions, convert improper fractions to mixed numbers, add and subtract fractions finding common denominators, and then moving onto multiplying and dividing fractions. All of which require a secure understanding of knowing, remembering and rapidly recalling times tables. It was excellent.

Next week is national anti-bullying week which we will be promoting by wearing odd socks to school on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> November. The Agents for Change leaders will also be leading assembly on this day promoting anti-racism and anti-bullying. The children will also be completing school safety and anti-bullying surveys across the next two weeks. School council will analyse the results and then act with Mrs Collins and the safeguarding leadership team on addressing priority areas. In addition to Odd Socks Day on Tuesday the 14<sup>th</sup> November, a reminder we are promoting Children in Need on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November. School Council will be running a cake sale for this at break time and after school.

I would like to congratulate one of our Year 2 pupils who competed in the Great British Irish Dancing Championships.
