It has been a brilliant first week back and your children deserve every credit for this.

## **Road Safety**

As the evenings draw in, it is even more important that we take care when accessing school at the beginning of the day and walking home at the end of the day. I have continued to lobby local council for: greater parking enforcement for cars parked illegally, 20 MPH speed restrictions at the beginning and end of school days, as well as a new (and repositioned) electronic speed alert display. The one outside school on Jaffray is not only broken, but not in the best place. This needs to be positioned on the bend leading into Jaffray Road, so that motorists slow down before taking the corner. I would ask that all parents please try and park away from the school if they can and walk in. That way we have less vehicles for parents, carers and children to avoid when accessing and leaving the school site. Thank you to the parents that are helping me with this cause to improve pedestrian safety and safeguarding for all children. I would ask that you continue to do this respectfully and without intrusion on other parents. We need to work together on this.

I would like to thank Mrs Ingrey for organising our Reading Café this week. Thank you also to all of the staff that pitched in to set up, host and clear up each day. This has been a tremendous success. Reading for pleasure is such an important part of the reading process. It is life-long! I would implore all parents and carers to read as much as the can with their children — at every opportunity.

#### Even More JTA news...Introducing 'The Big Raglan Walk to School'.

There are several children in Year 4, who mastered them last year that I am now quizzing on decimal timestables, squares, square roots, cubed numbers, and cube roots. Sensational!
