## As Mathematicians we will be...

* Adding and Subtracting 3-digit numbers using different methods.
Ł Counting in multiples of $4,8,50$ and 100.
* Recalling and using multiplication and division facts for the 3,4 and 8 multiplication tables.
^ Writing and calculating mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables we know. This includes two-digit numbers multiplied by one-digit numbers, using mental methods and progressing onto the formal written method.
$\star$ Solving problems, including missing number problems, involving multiplication and division.


## How can you help at home?

Continue to encourage your child to read at home every day where possible, including asking them simple questions about the text, making predictions and linking their books to other stories/books they have read. In addition, please continue to practise spelling common exception words from Year 2 and begin to learn those for Year 3.

Please help your child to quickly recall the 3,4 and 8 times tables and related division facts. Remind them to use doubling, the inverse $(3 \times 4,4 \times 3)$ and focus on the tricky facts they may be finding difficult. Please do not forget to revisit the 2,5 and 10 times tables and continue to play number bond games to 10 and 20 as well as practicing counting forwards and backwards in multiples of 50 .

## As Geographers...

We will be using maps and atlases to identify and locate the different parts of the UK and countries in Europe. We will be learning about key physical and human geographical features of these places and develop and use our geographical vocabulary.


## In PE...
