

Dear Parents and Carers,

To say that the weather has been ferociously cold is an understatement. Personally, I had hoped we'd have had some snow fall so that we could've had the children out in it and playing. Clearly, I would have enjoyed this as much as the children!

It has been a busy week of learning in school. Down in our Nursery and Reception classes I have seen some excellent independent learning through the continuous provision. Children independently writing and forming sentences as well as using the construction area to make 3D shapes. I thought at one point the children's tower in Monkeys Class was going to hit the roof such was their enthusiasm and construction work! By the time I had left the classroom the tower was up to my neck!

Year 1 children arrived in class after lunch earlier in the week to find that they had had a visitor! The 'Naughty Bus' had run rampant in the classrooms and caused mayhem! The children collected evidence of this and they wrote some wonderful posters asking for help to spot the 'Naughty Bus' to prevent it from doing further damage! I have been very happy with the Year 2 emphasis on times tables since returning from Christmas. I would urge all parents, but especially

Year 2 parents to please practise at home daily so that your children can master and secure at least 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 10s and 11s before the end of this year. Mastering these will make a monumental difference to accessing maths in Year 3, (in two terms time!) They are definitely worthy of consideration!

Frogs and Sharks have been using their observational skills this week in history, identifying pictures of past and present and comparing the differences – before articulating these. The pictures were not just structures and objects – it included staff which was a terrific catalyst for conversation amongst the children (and me!)

Year 3 have been busy focusing on their handwriting, sentence structure and editing in writing. Hopefully as the year moves forward the children will continue to strengthen this. Their creativity is wonderful. I do enjoy discussing their creative writing ideas. In terms of creativity, Year 4 have completed some incredible African Art pieces using shading and sketching this week.

Year 5 have been writing their applications to join the NASA Astronaut Programme. The children have identified their key skill sets and used these to persuade the NASA selection panel to consider them for the astronaut program. Year 6 have immersed themselves in their study of World War 2. This week they have researched the rise of Nazism and the impact of this on the Jewish community in Germany and then Europe. The children drafted informative writing pieces before completing the final edit in their English books. The quality of the writing was tremendous with an array of facts. The pieces engaged readers from the beginning. I would encourage parents to read this piece when you come in for Parents' Evenings.

Inspired Parent Assemblies

On Wednesday, Mrs Lane retuned to update the children on what she has been doing over the last year since she last led assembly. Amanda spoke to the children about her new challenge working for the Civil Service on helping British Citizens access roads across Europe now that Brexit is in effect. This, and facilitating the travel of lorries carrying essential goods into the UK. It was informative, fascinating and inspiring. Amanda focused on our Raglan Character Virtue 'Resilience.' This is because she explained to the children the process of achieving what her team did took many, many attempts and lots of negotiations. This was a tremendous example to the children of overcoming a massive challenge by never giving up. An enormous thank you to Amanda.



On Thursday, Key Stage 2 children were again inspired with a second parent assembly. Paul Hirons presented to the children his experiences of running marathons and ultra – marathons. He again spoke to the children about facing failure and picking yourself up and not giving up. This was truly inspirational and resonated with the children and staff attending. Once again, that message of building resilience was incredibly powerful. It was a very apt slide with the kangaroo jumping down the road because I do believe this symbolised the massive journeys that Paul has undertaken. 
