


Our topic this term ...


This half term the children in Reception will be looking at fairy tales and traditional tales. The children will be developing their communication and language skills through storytelling. The stories we will be focussing on



- Goldilocks and the Three Bears
- The Three Little Pigs
- Little Red Riding Hood

The children will also be learning about the Lunar New Year and discussing why some people celebrate this festival.







Mathematics

This term we will be comparing numbers up to 5, exploring the composition of 4 and 5, making pairs and combining two groups. The children will also continue to count to 20. We will compare length, height, mass and capacity and learn about time.

Phonics

During our phonics sessions will be revisiting the Phase 2 sounds and tricky words we have learnt and learning the Phase 3 sounds and the tricky words: he, we, me, be, will, was. We will continue to practise reading and writing phrases and simple sentences using the words and, the, to, I, a.



- P.E takes place every Monday and Wednesday for Lions and Monkeys. Children will need to continue to come into school in their full kit which includes; navy shorts/jogging bottoms/leggings, navy t. shirt and plimsolls/trainers that are labelled.
- Outdoor Learning will continue to take place on a Tuesday for Monkeys and on a Thursday for Lions. Children will need to come in to school dressed in their own clothes for their allocated session. Outdoor Learning sessions will commence in the week beginning Monday 9th January 2023.

How can you help at home?

 Practising reading and writing CVC words (e.g. cat, top, peg) and the Phase 2 tricky words at home with your child. You could use post-its, magnetic letters or your Mark Making Book.



- Encourage your child to count forwards and backwards up to 20 and beyond.
- Continue to promote a love of reading and encourage your child to retell stories in their own words and to begin to answer questions about the story. Ensure that you are reading the books that are sent home each week and recording it in their Reading Journal.
- Develop your child's independence and self help skills by encouraging them to dress and undress themselves.
