In English we are exploring...

'The Naughty Bus' and investigating all of the naughty things he has been up to! We will retell the story as if we are the Naughty Bus, write letters about the Naughty Bus and create new adventures for the Naughty Bus in our own sequels! We will also be exploring weather poems, and using alliteration and onamatepia to make our poems exciting.

We will be writing sentences using finger spaces, capital letters and full stops and also talking about using exclamation marks. We will continue to use adverbs of time (first, then, next, after that) and conjunctions (and, but, because, so).

In Phonics, we will be continuing Phase 5 and learning alternative sounds for the graphemes we know. We will continue to practise sounding out and blending using all the sounds we have already learnt, including in 'alien' words!

How can you help at home?

- Please encourage your child to write using finger spaces between every word and use full stops at the end of their sentences.
- Remind your child to form their letters correctly.
- Practise matching lower case and upper case letters.
- When reading at home, remind children to sound out and blend unfamiliar words using their phonics. Also, ask them questions to support their understanding. For example, what do you think the book is about? What will happen next? How do you think ... is feeling? How else could the story end?
- Practise recalling number bonds to 10 and for numbers to 10. For example, 0 + 5 = 5, 1 + 4 = 5. 2 + 3 = 5...

As mathematicians we will be...

Naming and sorting 3D shapes as well as continuing patterns with 2D and 3D shapes. We will then learn about place value and making and drawing a number using tens and ones.
