



Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you all had a wonderful half term. I am hoping that your children read a new book over the half term, (or are about to finish one), for upcoming World Book Day.

It has been a busy week of learning in our school this week. On my learning walks this week I timed my visit to EYFS very well indeed! The children in nursery were making vegetable soup! Children were also having great fun (whilst learning) listening to adults reading a story with puppet props.

I then visited the reception classes where I was really pleased with the quality of the children's sentence structuring, and their developing phonics knowledge. It was lovely to see the children enjoying construction as well as making bracelets using different elements of nature for a pattern.

I also timed my trips to KS2 well. Both Year 1 and 2 have been blitzing times tables this week, and looking for patterns within times tables. Year 1 have also been placing numbers in ascending and descending order. Year 2 have been exploring the commutative law in maths (swapping numbers and still getting the same answers.) Year 1 have also been exploring different elements of the weather. It was terrific to visit both year groups in PE and see Year 1 developing gymnastic movements and Year 2 children working together brilliantly as teams.

What a brilliant experience it is dropping into the ARPS each week. In Sharks and Frogs I have seen children learning Makaton and the new sign of the week (properties), securing phonics, and also working through their individual Speech and Language target work. It is terrific seeing the differentiated learning that goes on – often there are 5 or 6 different learning experiences happening. This is done to try and meet the individual needs of children as much as possible.

Year 3 have produced some stunning Art pieces this week. The use of the colour blue as a back drop for their Art pieces was highly effective. In English children have been developing their retrieval skills by reading and learning about Elephants in Africa and Asia; as well as finding out the differences between the two species of elephants. I was filled with joy dropping into maths sessions in Year 4 across the week. They have been converting improper fractions to mixed numbers and vice versa. This is underpinned by a knowledge of times tables. You cannot do this effectively without knowing your times tables. Children in Year 4 have also begun science work on living organisms. More to follow on this!

Once again I was wowed by Year 5 maths books! Children have been securing learning perimeter and compound shapes. They have also been solving perimeter themed logic and reasoning questions. In whole class reading Year 5 have also been developing their retrieval and inference skills. In Year 6 children have been securing more complex area and perimeter questions; using algebraic formulas to do so. I really look forward to my teaching commitments in Year 6 each week. I was delighted to begin the creative writing piece based on the story of the Alchemist's Son. The range of vocabulary that children are using in their narrative pieces is growing substantially and therefore is their depth of description and pace of the story itself which makes you feel like you are part of what the children are writing.

Learning is for Everyone at Raglan and Our Curriculum Drivers - Assembly

This week in whole school assembly I reminded the children about our philosophy for learning and curriculum drivers. Our curriculum drivers are the values that underpin and thread their way through the topics the children learn. These drivers were established before my time, but still absolutely resonate and are meaningful for our school, local, national and global communities. Our curriculum drivers are:

Initiative – Get Up and Do it Environment – Making a Difference Community and Diversity – Belonging Communication – Finding Your Voice

There is a small catch phrase for each that I have come up with, which I hope the children will remember and know what we mean by each driver. Our curriculum drivers work in tandem with our Raglan Character Virtues of KIND, READY, SAFE, CONFIDENT, RESILIENT and INDEPENDENT. It goes without saying that we are aspirational in our expectations that children reach their full potential academically. That said, it is equally important that all children develop our Raglan Character virtues and secure the nature of our curriculum drivers, because these are the skills and attributes that will help your children succeed through every phase of their schooling and life.

The Reception children listened to the story Martha's Maps and drew maps of forest school during our outdoor learning sessions.


We also discussed and learnt about the traditional Christian Festival 'Shrove Tuesday' and had fun making and tasting pancakes.

Maths Glorious Maths!

I would like to thank the terrific number of parents and carers who came along to our Maths Information Evening yesterday. This was led by Mr Farmer, our Maths Leader. He covered the mastery approach to maths that we use, showed the progression of maths and what children are required to do across KS1 and KS2. In addition to this, he also explained to parents the times tables expectations we have at Raglan.

Several of you have asked about the various methods we use for calculations. The link <u>here</u> takes you directly to the Maths Calculation Policy on our website to save you trying to find it. This is a good place to start. In addition to this we are looking to hold a follow up 'calculations maths evening' which will be a practical session showing the methods we teach children for maths across the year groups. This will be a very useful session to attend as it will help you with home learning for maths. The date of this evening is Thursday $23^{\rm rd}$ May $6 {\rm pm} - 7 {\rm pm}$. We have capacity for 60 people and will confirm to you later in the year how to book your place.
