#### Dear Parents and Carers,

They provide the staff team with the motivation to keep going the extra mile.

I would like to thank the staff team for their unrelenting efforts in providing the terrific service they do for your children. I have endless conversations about children across every day and week. You would expect this because we are a school. That said, there is something extra, something special about the level of care and nurture staff provide all children. The staff team are constantly trying to think of new ways to engage children with learning and support their well-being. The children are, and always will be at the heart of our school.

#### Parents' Evening Feedback

I would like to thank you all for the overwhelming and incredible support you have for the school and your children's teachers. Your praise and appreciation of them and the entire staff team is very humbling and means a huge amount to the staff.

Thank you for your constructive feedback also. I have asked Mrs Prescott to arrange for external and internal signage to help facilitate entry, direction to classes and exiting. I think we also need to look at external lighting as well. Although most parents and carers are very happy with home learning, we are looking at our home learning provision going forward. There will be more to come on this after half term, in preparation for the summer term we hope. Home learning is never an easy project to ensure complete satisfaction. Some parents and carers want more, some less, some think the current provision is great, and some do not want it at all! I look at home learning like this; it has to support what we do at school, help develop the key skills (Reading / Writing / Times tables / Maths), allow children opportunities to research and be creative and prepare children for what lies ahead at secondary school. What I mean by secondary school is that getting your child into a solid and consistent routine with home learning from the onset will make the adjustment and transition to secondary that much smoother. I wish to thank you all for the huge number of positive comments about the information that was conveyed to you in the 10 minute time slot you had at parents' evening. We appreciate that it is a lot to get in, which is why the class teachers prepare the way they do in advance. So many of you commented on the excellent organisation, preparation and information delivered by the teachers. Ideally we would love to give you all more time but this would add enormously to an already huge workload that the teachers have.

We are so very grateful for the partnership that we have with you. I will be the first person to put up my hand to say that we don't get things 100% correct on every occasion, but we do everything we can to learn and improve. What the staff do ensure is an unrelenting determination to try to provide the very best of service, provision, environment, education and care for your children. We don't ever take for granted the partnership we have with you, and the strength of this means that our school has the community spirit it does. Again, on behalf of the staff team, thank you for your incredible support and kind words.

#### **Assembly News**

This week has been a very busy week of assemblies.

On Monday, as part of Safer Internet Week, Miss Grange (our Computing Leader) led assembly for Online Safety. She reminded children of some very key online safety messages such as: telling a trusted adult if an unknown person is trying to access them online, reporting negative behaviours and language used online in chat and not participating in these conversations, as well as not sharing any personal information with people that are unknown to them. Miss Grange also covered the issue of phishing and filtering in order to raise children's awareness of these two areas, and why children need to be alert to these. On Tuesday, as part of National Mental Health Week our Mental Health Leader (Mrs Turner) and ELSA Leader (Mrs Henderson) led an assembly. This was very informative for children. This year's mental health week theme is My Voice Matters. We learnt that every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views taken seriously. We shared a story about how a young person spoke up and used their voice to make a difference to something that mattered to them. Your Voice Matters: at Raglan we do things as a team. When we join together we can make the biggest impact.



On Wednesday, we had Rebecca Tanner from the London Borough of Bromley Hearing Impaired Team. This was an excellent opportunity for children to see how people with hearing impairment navigate the world around them. Rebecca was wonderfully supported by one of the children from our Speech and Language Provision (who is hearing impaired.) The presentation also featured one of the 'Gladiators' who is hearing impaired. The children found this inspiring as the 'Gladiator' hears nothing when competing! This was a superb presentation for children to experience.



On Friday, I led the half termly 'Certificate and House Points Championship Assembly.' I would like to congratulate all of the children that received Head Teacher Certificates for firstly, sustained outstanding behaviour for learning and secondly, for being an excellent role model at lunchtimes. The sheer volume of children that could have received these certificates is huge and I would encourage all those that were not nominated this time to keep being the very best person they can be. You all matter and you are all the best of role models and learners. All of these children receive 20 House Points for their efforts. This number of House Points can only be given for these half termly certificates.



Congratulations to Green House for their triumph this half term. This is an excellent achievement and a total team effort. As a result of their victory, on Friday  $23^{rd}$  February children in Green House only will be allowed to attend school dressed completely in green, partially in green, or wear school uniform with a green accessory.
