In English we will ...

This term we will be going back in time to Victorian era and reading 'Daisy saves the Day' by Shirley Hughes. This book looks at the life of a young scullery maid. The children will write a job application letter, a diary entry, a newspaper report and a non-chronological report. We will be focussing on using different punctuation including apostrophes, conjunctions and using words with the suffixes —ly, -ment, -ness. In Phonics, we will continue to learn the Phase 6 suffix rules and begin to learn the Phase 6 graphemes.

- Learning the 2, 5 and 10 times tables

- Tell the difference between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive, and apply this in a range of contexts.
