# Dear Parents and Carers,

What a week it has been for learning in our school. My learning journey this week across the school has focused primarily on reading as we celebrated World Book Day yesterday. In Year 6 children have been reading Goodnight Mr Tom for their whole class reading lessons. This is a terrific book and a wonderful story to read as part of the World War 2 topic Year 6 have been immersed in this term. They have been focusing this week on the VIPER Skills of explaining, predicting, inferring and retrieving. Year 6 have also been learning about pie charts and using their knowledge of fractions and percentages to solve pie chart problems. Year 5 have been reading Cosmic in their whole class reading sessions. They have been loving the story and this week been focusing on the VIPER skills of inferring, explaining, vocabulary and inference. Year 5 have continued with their work on making 'cams' in DT which will be used to make their movable toys later in the term.

Across the ARPS children have been taking part in their whole class, small group and individual reading sessions. I have seen the children working on their daily individual speech targets with the adults, as well as working in differentiated groups focusing on reading skills. Children have been learning and reinforcing their phonics knowledge and using this to consolidate diagraphs as well. It is amazing to see how the adults across the provision differentiate the learning to target the individual children's needs (and within small groups as well).

Year 3 have been using a text about Sea Fishing in whole class reading this week to develop and strengthen the VIPER skills of retrieval and explaining. In maths they have been using partitioning to solve multiplication problems. Their use of times tables has been imperative for this! Year 4 have been reading The Boy Who Grew the Dragon in whole class reading. The children have really enjoyed this book. It gives them the unexpected! The children have been focusing on the VIPER skills of inferring, explaining and retrieving. It has been wonderful to see Year 4 children using the bar model to subtract fractions from whole numbers! This is something that Year 6 have to know as it appears every year on the arithmetic SAT paper.

In KS1 I have been looking at phonics lessons this week. It has been excellent seeing the children in Year 1 and Year 2 strengthening their knowledge of diagraphs and split diagraphs. In Year 2 especially, children were looking at the rules for adding the ending of words to change the tense and then applying the spelling rule to complete this. Year 1 have also been reading about wolves and using information to complete fact boxes about them. In Reception children have been learning about the life cycle of frogs and it has been amazing to listen to the children explaining this in well-constructed sentences. The phonics provision for reception continues to be a strong one and the children are growing in confidence using their developing knowledge. Children in Nursery have been making gifts for Mothers' Day (spoiler alert!) They have been learning to, and consolidating writing their names and the narrative in cards for their mums.

# **Agents for Change**

Yesterday our Agents for Change leaders hosted Year 5 children from Wickham Common Primary School. Wickham Common is one of the Compass Trust Schools (who will be part of the merger between our CSAT Trust and Compass). Our Agents for Change have pioneered the program within our Trust and are now inspiring and helping others to become part of this movement. The Agents for Change champion equality and diversity, promoting the protected characteristics. Our Agents lead assemblies, are KS1 play mentors, role-model outstanding behaviour and leadership to KS1 and KS2, as well as mentor and train younger aspiring agents. We are incredibly proud of their commitment and work. They have been the very best of what our school stands for. They are not just inspiring our pupils but making a real difference across our Trust! Well done to our Agents for Change!







#### World Book Day Assembly

Yesterday I led our World Book Day assembly. This was a celebration of books and reading. The Reading Ambassadors and I shared with the children books that we have recently read. I shared three books with the children. These were Michael Morpurgo's 'Kensuke's Kingdom', Rudyard Kipling's 'Just So Stories' and, Simon Hughes' 'And God Created Cricket'. These are books I love and sharing these with the children was a real treat. The children had an opportunity to ask the Reading Ambassadors questions about the books they had read which was terrific. All children had an opportunity to share their books with their peers across the day and all children had an opportunity to write a 'book blurb' about the book they had brought into school. The aim is to have a display in each class of the books read and shared. Hopefully the 'book blurbs' will inspire children to want to read books their peers have reviewed and enjoyed.
