Our Topic this term

This half term the children in Nursery will be diving in to the topic 'Under the Sea'.

We will be reading the books Tiddler, Sharing a Shell, The Rainbow Fish, and Barry the Fish with Fingers. Some of which you may be familiar with already.

The children will be learning about the sea environment and what creatures live there. They will be familiar with different forms of sea life and producing some lovely creations during their craft sessions.

They will be using different media and materials to create 3d models, thank you for those of you who have been donating materials for these activities.

Phonics...

The children will continue their learning with phase 1 sounds this term and developing their speaking, listening and attention skills. We will focus on voice sounds and tuning into sounds in our environment. We will be distinguishing between the differences in vocal sounds including oral blending and segmenting.

As mathematicians we will

Continuing to count and relate numbers up to 5. Identifying the symbols and counting objects in play. The children will learn to experiment with their own symbols to represent numbers.

We have been shape hunting and the children will be familiar with the 3D shapes, cylinder and spheres..

We will also be sorting objects according to properties to shape and size.

Don't forget:
