This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Curriculum music

At Raglan, we have developed and follow an ambitious Music curriculum with content that is relevant, progressive, broad and balanced.

Our Threshold Concepts were developed across our Academy Trust and with BYMT (Bromley Youth Music Trust) to ensure full coverage of the National Curriculum and the progression in knowledge and skills across all year groups.

These Threshold Concepts outline the expected learning outcomes at the end of Year 2, Year 4 and Year 6. As a school, we further broke these concepts down to provide teaching staff with the expected learning outcomes for the end of each year group and these are outlined in our Milestone documents. We also ensure that the Music curriculum upholds Raglan's curriculum drivers: Initiative, Environment, Community and Diversity and Communication.

As a school, we teach Music using specialist teachers from the Bromley Youth Music Trust (BYMT). We have chosen to use specialist teaching from BYMT as we are confident that it ensures these learning outcomes are met in line with our school's Milestones, trust's Threshold Concepts and therefore, the national vision for Music outlined in the National Curriculum.

Co-curricular music

We work alongside “Rock steady” a company dedicated to children loving and enjoying music. Children are able to attend weekly session where they learn a range of instruments or vocal performances. This is celebrated throughout the year with performances and shows to both parents and children.

We also offer children the opportunity to attend 1:1 music lessons for a range of instruments.

In Key Stage 1, children are able to attend the “Infant Song Festival” to celebrate and enjoy music amongst other schools.

Musical experiences

Music is not limited to music lessons within the classroom; Key Stage 1 and 2 have weekly inspiring singing assemblies run by a BYMT teacher. Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 have a collaborative Christmas production every year which is an excellent opportunity for them to discover their voices and learn more about expressive arts. In keeping with our Raglan values, the children confidently perform in front of large audiences of adults. Key Stage 2 also get the opportunity to be audience members.

In the future

In the future, we hope that an increasing number of children enjoy music at Raglan. We hope to take a choir to the Young Voices annual event. We hope to continue to work alongside BYMT to provide a high quality of music lessons.
