## HOW WE KEEP YOU SAFE AT RAGLAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

### WHEN TO SPEAK TO THE SAFEGUARDING TEAM

If someone is bullying you or has done or said something you do not like.

If someone has touched you on your private parts or on a part of your body you do not like or the touch is inappropriate.

If someone has offered you a tablet, a vape, a cigarette or a drink that you do not know what is in it.

If someone has hit, punched, kicked or hurt you in any way.

If someone sends you messages online that make you feel uncomfortable.

### The 4 main areas of Child Protection.

Child abuse is when anyone under the age of 18 is either being harmed or not properly looked after.

**Physical Abuse** - This can be if a child is hit, kicked, smacked, shaken, burnt or bitten.

**Sexual Abuse**- This can be if a child is touched where or in a way they do not want to be touched or if it is inappropriate. This can also be sending pictures or messages online.

**Neglect** - This can be if a child does not have meals, clothing, warmth or medical support (eg doctor or dental appointments they need).

**Emotional Abuse** - This can be if someone upsets you, or makes you feel sad, helpless or worthless.

We keep you safe in lots of different ways. Your teachers are trained and know how to keep you safe and make sure you have someone to talk to if you need.

If you are upset or worried about something that has happened to you or someone else, please tell an adult so that we can listen and help you.

### What happens when you talk to an adult at Raglan Primary School?

If you speak to an adult, sometimes they will need to check with the Safeguarding Team and if they can deal with the problem in school they will.

Sometimes the Safeguarding Team will need to speak to other professionals like Social Workers, Doctors or Police Officers.

This is because schools cannot solve everything on their own and will need some help.

The Safeguarding Team are here to help and to explain everything.
