In English we will be exploring ...

Lila and the Secret of Rain by David Conway, the story of a young airl who tries to save her village from the terrible drought. We will writing a setting description and a diary entry in role as Lila, writing rain songs and instructions for making a rainmaker. We will be learning to use varied vocabulary to create detail and interest, including adjectives to make noun phrases, adverbs and varied sentence starters. We will continue to use different punctuation. including apostrophes for contractions and possession and a variety of conjunctions (but, because, so, if, when, or). We will be continuing to spell words using the suffixes -ful, -ment, -ness, -ly.



In Phonics, we will be learning the Phase 6 alternative graphemes.

In Class Reading, we will be reading the Claude in the City by Alex T. Smith.

As mathematicians, we will be...

- Exploring thirds in different contexts, for example, of a length, shape or group of objects
- Exploring the equivalence of two quarters and one half of the same whole
- Using our knowledge of halves, thirds and quarters to count in fractions from any number up to 10
- Recapping how to tell the time to the hour and half past the hour
- Learning quarter past and quarter to the hour
- Telling the time to 5 minutes intervals, both past and to the hour

How can you help at home?

- Encourage your child to read the time on an analogue clock to o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past the hour and talk about the time of day.
- Encourage children to use measuring equipment at home such as, rulers, weighing scales and measuring jugs to secure their knowledge of reading different scales and becoming familiar with different units of measurement ie. cm, m, g, kg, ml and l.
- When walking around the local area, discuss the different human and physical features and even use a map to navigate short routes!

In Science we will.....

- Continue with our unit: Investigating Living Things
- Make observations of local microhabitats and the creatures that live there
- Understand how living things adapt to their habitat
- Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals

In RE we will

- Explore the question: How important is the prophet Muhammad to Muslims?
- Look at the life of the prophet
 Muhammad and the part he played in the start of Islam
- Make personal connections about who is special to us and how we should treat them
