This term



This term, we will be focusing on being happy to wave good-bye to our grown-ups and becoming settled and familiar with the Nursery surroundings. We will be learning our friends' names and the Nursery routines, such as carpet time, lunch time and home time, with the use of our visual time table. We will be learning how to play, share and take turns with the resources on offer. We will also be focusing on our self help skills by using the toilet independently and taking our coats on and off by ourselves.

We will also be learning our Nursery classroom rules and fire drill procedures.

There are a lot of new experiences! Each week the children will be introduced to a book, shape, number, word and Makaton sign and will be using Concept cat to help with our learning. Please look out for details of these on our Nursery notice-board.

As a team we are getting to know your children and learning all about what they like to do and their personal interests.

Chipmunk Reminders...

Please ensure that all items at Nursery are clearly named and ensure your child brings a **named water bottle daily**. A range of healthy snacks will be provided by the Nursery team every session.

Please could your child bring in a coat to school, as they will be going outside every day. Practising how to do it up and take it off at home would be very much appreciated.

Children have continuous access to the outdoor area throughout the year. It is essential that your child wears appropriate clothing according to the weather and shoes with Velcro fastenings is preferable. The children will have daily opportunities to develop their gross and fine motor skills.

We will be making our own Family Book which, when finished, will be in our book corner for the children to look at. **Please could you send in a family photo that we can put in our book** or allow us to photocopy the original and we will return the original home. This is a great opportunity to develop your child's communication and language skills.

Phonics and Nursery Rhymes

This term the children will be focusing on Phonics Unlocking Letters and sounds phase 1. Children will be tuning into sounds, listening to the sounds around in them in their everyday environment. They will be developing their speaking, listening and attention skills.

Children will learn a nursery rhyme each week. This term we will be focusing on Heads, shoulders, knees and toes and Tommy Thumb. Please see the Nursery noticeboard and encourage your child to practise at home.

How can you help at home?

Keyworker

Your child will have one of the Nursery team staff as their keyworker in Nursery. The keyworker's duties are:

- To build a good relationship with your child, to assist with their settling in period.
- To learn and enhance your child's interests through play.
- To assess your child following the EYFS Framework.
- To discuss your child's learning journal and development with you at parent meetings twice a year.
- To be your first point of contact if you have any concerns regarding your child.



Star of the Week and our Recognition Board at Raglan...

Our aim is for everyone to have a great time learning at Raglan, being kind, ready for learning and keeping each other safe. Children have the opportunity for their names to go on the Recognition Board for making good choices and doing their best with their learning. They are then rewarded with a sticker at the end of the day.

Every week a child will be picked as 'Star of the Week', which they feel is a great honour! The Star of the Week will be allowed to take home the class Chipmunk named Chip and Pin to look after at the weekend. You and your child may wish to write, take photographs or draw pictures of their adventures. Due to data protection, we will send your child home with a plastic wallet with pieces of paper to share their weekend. This will then be stuck into the class Star of the Week Book.
