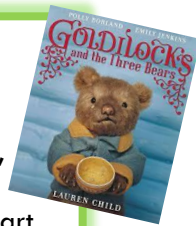


In English we will ...

Explore Goldilocks and the Three Bears by Lauren Child. We will be writing character descriptions, an apology letter, the story from Goldilock's perspective and instructions for how to make the perfect porridge. We will be learning to start our sentences in different ways and use noun phrases, different punctuation (? ! . ,) and different conjunctions in our writing.

In Phonics, we will begin by revising Phase 5 and learning about the alternative graphemes for different sounds and where they are usually located in words.

In Year 2, we start Class Reading and develop our key reading skills: VIPERS. We will be reading the books *Red* by Bethan Woollvin and *Goldilocks and Just One Bear* by Leigh Hodgkinson. Children will also continue to develop their word reading and comprehension skills through weekly guided reading groups with their class teacher.

Home Learning

Spelling Home Learning- The weekly activity is based on that week's phonics learning. The activity will be given out as a paper copy in the green Home Learning book **every Friday**. Please ensure it is returned to school by **Wednesday** each week.

Times Tables Rocks Stars - Please log in to TTRS each week to practise the 2, 5, 10 and 3 multiplication tables. Logins are stuck in the front of Home Reading Journals and the green Home Learning books.

Reading - Children should be reading **at least three times a week**. If your child is reading a book band up to and including Orange, they will have one book a week to support them to re-read for decoding, prosody and comprehension. Please talk to your child about what they have read to develop their comprehension skills and enjoyment of reading. Look back at the Reading at Home letter for questions you could ask your child when reading. **record any reading in the Home Reading Journal. Children can change their book every day.**

Teach Your Monster to Read— Children can log onto TYMTR. Logins are stuck in the front of Home Reading Journals and the green Home Learning books.

As mathematicians we will be...

- Reading and writing numbers to 100 in numerals and words
- Recognising tens and ones
- Partitioning numbers to 100
- Comparing and ordering numbers to 100
- Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s
- Counting in 3s

How can you help at home?

- Please practise counting to and from 100.
- Practise counting in steps 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s and begin to learn the 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables.
- Continue to practise recalling number bonds to 10 and 20.
- Talk about the time during the day and practise telling the time to o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past on an analogue clock.
- When your child is writing, please encourage them to join their letters and remind them to form their letters correctly and check they are a consistent size.
- Please try to read for ten minutes every day. Your child can read their reading book but also read their library book or another book to them!

In Science we will.....

- Explore the unit: Understanding Animals and Humans
- Learn how humans and other animals are born, grow and change, and what we need to survive and be healthy.
- Classify different kinds of animal babies.
- Learn about the basic needs that are shared by humans and animals.

In Geography we will.....

- Explore the unit: Our World
- Locate the seven continents and the five oceans on a world map.
- Locate the UK on a world map and learn which continent it is a part of.
- Learn how a country's proximity to the equator and poles affects their climate.
- Look at aerial photos of different cities and identify the human and physical features.
- Identify the human and physical features of the capital cities and countries of the UK.

In Computing we will ...

- Explore the unit: Route Explorers.
- Code using 2Go.
- Write simple instructions to move a screen turtle along routes.
- Consider direction and distance.
- Create commands and build an algorithm.
- Begin the unit: The Internet.
- Understand what the internet is and define the World Wide Web.
- Recognise browsers and websites.
- Connect to the internet.

Year 2 Wider Curriculum Autumn 1

In PE we will

- Work with our Sports Coach, Coach Alhaji, to hit and return a ball with consistency.
- Challenge ourselves to move imaginatively to music in our Dance unit.

In Music we will

- Explore the unit: Tony Chestnut
- Improvise rhythms along to a backing track using the note C or G.
- Compose call-and-response music.
- Play the melody on a tuned percussion instrument.
- Sing with good diction.
- Recognise and play echoing phrases by ear.

In RE we will

- Think about the question 'Is it possible to be kind to everyone all of the time?'
- Explore stories from the Bible that show kindness.
- Explore how these stories make Christians behave towards other people.

In D&T we will....

- Complete the unit: Baby Bear's Chair.
- Identify features that make a chair stable.
- Explain how their ideas would be suitable for Baby Bear.
- Produce a model that supports a teddy, using the appropriate materials and construction techniques.
- Explain how they made their model strong, stiff and stable.
