Mathematics

This term we will be comparing numbers up to 5, exploring the composition of 4 and 5, making pairs and combining two groups. The children will also continue to count to 20. We will compare length, height, mass and capacity and learn about time.

Phonics

In our **phonics sessions**, we will focus on mastering Phase 3 sounds and learning common exception words. We will also practise reading and writing simple phrases and sentences.



How can you help at home?

- Practising reading and writing CVC words (e.g. cat, top, peg) and the Phase 2 common exception words at home with your child. You could use post-its, magnetic letters or your Mark Making Book.
- Encourage your child to count forwards and backwards up to 20 and beyond.
- Continue to promote a love of reading and encourage your child to retell stories in their own words and to begin to answer questions about the story. Ensure that you are reading the books that are sent home each week and recording it in their Reading Journal.
- Develop your child's independence and self help skills by encouraging them to dress and undress themselves.
