

## Our Topic this term ....

We will be introducing the topic 'growing' to the children. In Literacy, we will be focusing on the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk'.

We will be recalling the story using actions and key phrases from the text and describing the Giant using lots of rich vocabulary.

The children will be growing their very own beanstalks and have fun learning about what they need to grow. We will also learn about lifecycles, babies, plants and what they need in order to grow. We are always grateful for any resources such as: flower pots, seeds, bulbs, plants and baby clothes.

Please can you bring in an old baby photo of your child in a labelled envelope for us to use as part of our learning, introducing an understanding of past and present. We will also enjoy learning about Easter and it's importance to Christians.



## As mathematicians we will...

The children will be learning about measuring using non standard units (lolly sticks, footsteps etc.). This ties in nicely with our growing topic as we will begin to measure the growth of plants in our classroom and discuss how we have grown since babies. We will also be learning how to make bonds to 10 and make 3d shapes.

**Phonics** During our **phonics sessions** will be continue to learn the phase 3 sounds which will include digraphs. We will be learning to read and write the phase 3 tricky words. We will be continue to learn to read simple sentences using all the sounds and words we have learnt.

- Outdoor Learning will continue to take place on a Tuesday for Monkeys and on a Thursday for Lions. Children will need to come in to school dressed in their PE kit.
