Kit list and what to/ not to bring

Kit List

It is always handy for the children to have a checklist of the items in his/her suitcase.

- ☺ Sturdy suitcase/ travel bag with label on clearly stating name and school. Your child must be able to carry these themselves!
- ☺ Comfortable trainers/ shoes suitable for walking on wet, rough ground.
- ☺ Waterproof Jacket (which can easily fit in the rucksack)
- ☺ Shoes for the beach i.e. flip flops
- ☺ Hat/cap for sun protection.
- ☺ Warm jumpers/ cardigans (2)
- ☺ Underwear for 5/6 days
- ☺ Several pairs of socks (at least 6)
- ☺ Jeans/ trousers/ shorts/ skirts
- ☺ T-shirts/ blouses
- ☺ Slippers
- ☺ Pyjamas/ night dress
- ☺ Dressing gown
- ☺ Suitable swimming costume
- ☺ 2 towels (1 beach, 1 washing)
- ☺ Wash kit (including soap, flannels, shampoo, deodorants- no aerosols, toothpaste, toothbrush etc). You may want to put these in small sandwich bags so they do not leak over luggage.
- ☺ Carrier bags for dirty washing/ wet items.
- ☺ Stamps and home address

- ☺ Sun protection cream/ lotion

You may want to bring a camera, but remember this is at your own risk, so a disposable one may be a good idea!

Back pack

- ☺ Small rucksack- to keep lunch, equipment in for each day (needs to keep hands free and be comfortable)
- ☺ Lunch for the outward journey, best loose so we can throw/ recycle packaging on the journey.
- ☺ Named water bottle (not glass)
- ☺ Named purse or wallet
- ☺ Small activities for the longer journeys
- ☺ Waterproof jacket (preferably with hood)
- ☺ Sun hat
- ☺ Pencil case with pencil, rubber, sharpener and coloured pencils

Kit list and what to/ not to bring

Things To Bring

- ✓ Sweets are allowed for the outward journey and on the way home, but please ensure that your child is not over-loaded with sweets, as the children will not get a good night's sleep, or may become ill and consequently will be tired the next day. We have a no sweet sharing policy and we ask parents to please remember we are a nut free school.
- ✓ Children may bring small activities as they are good for the coach journeys. If you do have an MP3 type player they can bring this but we will not be taking any responsibility for these items, they are taken at the children's own risk. No phones are allowed, even just for music purposes.
- ✓ Children may bring a disposable or digital camera with them for the week. They will be collected at the end of every day for safe keeping and will not be allowed in rooms. They must be labelled clearly.
- ✓ Please don't pack the children's best clothes as if they get muddy or sandy we don't want them upset. Older clothes for the beach including old trainers or flip flops would be ideal.
- ✓ Children must bring a named water bottle which they can refill each day at the hotel. The children will get a drink in with their packed lunch, but they will also need water throughout the day, particularly if it is hot.
- ✓ The children also must bring a hat for sun protection.
- ✓ All cameras and MP3 players must be clearly labelled, as they will be collected in at the end of every day for safe keeping and will not be allowed in rooms.
- ✓ The children's pocket money will be put in the hotel safe when we arrive. Each day the children will be given £5. Please make sure the £20.00 has been paid into the School office by 7th July 2024. This would be helpful if it was in £5.00 denominations as we are a cashless office.
- ✓ Please do not allow your child to take any money apart from that being held by teachers.

Things not to bring

- ☺ Any precious, expensive things or things with great sentimental value.
- ☺ Absolutely **NO chewing gum**, **mobile phones**.
- ☺ No gaming consoles
- ☺ Loads and loads of sweets!
- ☺ iPads, Smartwatches (simple 'fitbits' with no messaging or call facility only)
- ☺ Aerosol sprays, they can sometimes set off modern fire alarms

Rules and Rewards in the Isle of Wight

Please go through these with your child before signing the 'Consent, Medical and contact' form. You are signing to say you have read, understood and agreed these. Thank you.

Expected behaviour on the Isle of Wight

- Children must follow the adult's directions at all times.
- To use appropriate language and be respectful to each other and members of the public- treating others as they would like to be treated themselves.
- To be friendly, helpful and caring- supporting classmates.
- There must be no running anywhere in the hotel.
- To respect other people's property and belongings.
- Children are not allowed in each other's rooms.
- Beds must not be jumped on as they have slats and will break.
- Seat belts must be worn at all times on the coach.
- Absolutely no mobile phones, chewing gum or make-up are to be brought.
- **Any child who is consistently not following the instructions from adults or is not following the rules will miss an evening activity.**
- **Any child who consistently misbehaves or acts in a dangerous or serious manner will be sent home. It will be the parents' responsibility to collect the child from the Isle of Wight at their own expense.**

Rewards

- There will be groups each led by an adult.
- All children will be awarded points for good behaviour, table manners, learning, thinking skills and a whole host of other things.
- Every day the points will be written on a chart displayed in the meeting point of the hotel.
- At the end of the week, the group with the most points will be given a prize.
- Room inspections will take place every day. Adults will inspect each room and award points for the condition of the bathroom, cupboards, bed, floor and extra points will be given for special effort.
- There may well be a sand sculpture competition on Sandown beach. Winners will be awarded.

Room allocations and Groups

- All children have been given a preference form.
- Rooms are of varying sizes will be allocated by Mr Farmer and Mr Sykes
- Groups will be led by an adult – this is where children spend most of their time.
- Groups mix throughout the day
- Seats on the bus are free choice but will be fixed for the rest of the week.

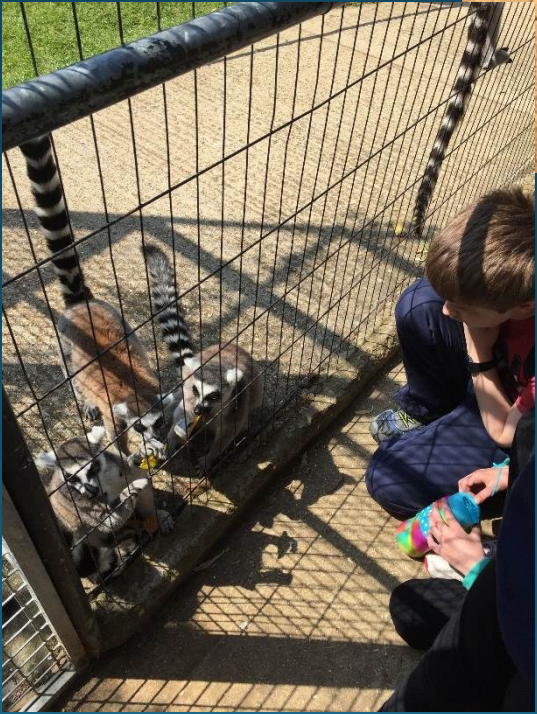
